NJ State Trooper **A. Raspa** lost his life in the line of duty when his Patrol vehicle struck a deer and then veered into a tree off of interstate 195 in upper Freehold early Saturday morning May 30th, 2015.

He and his partner were both transported to Central State Hospital where Trooper Raspa succumbed to his injuries. His partner Trooper Gene Hong was treated for lacerations and neck injuries and released the same day as the crash.

Trooper Raspa had served with the NJ State Police for 19 Months. He served our state with honor, dignity, and courage. We are reminded that the simplest tasks in Law Enforcement can end or lead to tragedy!

He will not be forgotten and we honor his memory!

Bergen County Sheriff's Lieutenant **Brian Beutel** passed away Wednesday evening 3-18-2015 after going into cardiac arrest at a charity basketball game.

Beutel, a father of five daughters, collapsed during the "Battle of the Blue" fundraiser for the Tomorrows Children Fund (which assist children who have cancer) at Fairleigh Dickerson University. He was Transported to Hackensack University Medical Center, where he was pronounced dead.

Beutel was a 15 year veteran in the Corrections Department and had transferred to the Sheriff's Office in 2002 where he was promoted to Lieutenant in 2013. **He will be sorely missed and never forgotten!**

Middlesex County Corrections **LT. Mark Eichert** is an 18 year veteran of the DOC. In late 2014 Mark was diagnosed with Stage 4 Colon Cancer. Surgery to remove the mass was conducted in November 2014. He returned to work in January 5, 2015 in the middle of an intensive 4 month chemo treatment.

In true Mark Eichert fashion, he reported to work with his chemo pump attached for the following 2 days of treatment. On May 6, 2015, Mark underwent another procedure to remove any lingering cancer cells in addition to what is still considered an experimental procedure, a "chemo wash". Mark has been out of work ever since and is out of paid leave. Mark has a wife and 2 beautiful children who are affected as well but are keeping Mark and everyone else's spirits high.

NJ Senior Corrections Officer **James Pieper** was employed by the Juvenile Justice Commission (JCC) when he restrained an inmate during a fight. James sustained a severe spinal injury which led to cervical and lumbar infusions. This left James with 3 titanium plates fused to 4 cages in his spine.

The surgeon determined that James was unable to perform his duties as a correction officer and was forced to resign and apply for a disability pension through the PFRS. James was denied because the PFRS doctor reported that James can return to work without restriction. The JCC has refused to reinstate James due to conflicting doctors reports. James is appealing his case but is financially devastated due to his injuries.

James' family has lost almost everything they own and their house is in foreclosure, which has forced them to move in with his parents. James' life has been destroyed for simply doing his job! The POB is committed in helping him through this ordeal.
